"We have Julian Webber joining us to speak about microscopes, Kreena Patel speaking about deep marginal elevation, Roberto Carredu is going to speak about vital pulp therapy, and Marcela Salamanca is going to be speaking about auto-transplantation. I promise you that, whatever your level of experience, you will go away with some clinical tips from them and, if you're a little earlier on in your career, you'll have lots of new clinical insights.
