ESE Congress 2025

Held in Paris in collaboration with Société Française d'Endodontie

This month, many of our BES Council attended the European Society of Endodontology Biennial Congress in Paris.

It was great to connect with so many of our membership who attended our BES Drinks Reception, fast becoming a popular tradition at the Congress. We were pleased to present Professor Hal Duncan with an acknowledgement of the tremendous success of the IEJ this year in getting to 3rd in the ranking of Dental Journals and raising the IF to 7.1.

Additionally, Dr Phil Tomson delivered a Pre-Congress Workshop on the topic of Vital Pulp Therapy, whilst Dr Maria Lessani and working groups presented the ongoing work of the society in standards for endodontics for foundation dentists and trauma guidance for the public.



"Excellent pain management is a key pillar of dentistry and endodontics, so I'm honoured to have the opportunity of having two lectures at the meeting – one will be on anaesthesia and the other on analgesia.

"In both lectures we will identify the reasons why it's sometimes difficult to achieve profound anaesthesia and provide adequate pain control post-operatively. We'll also review evidence-based strategies for how to overcome these challenges. It's my hope that every participant in the meeting will gain knowledge, learn new clinical tips that can be readily applied in the clinic to overcome these challenges, and provide painless treatment for their patients."

The sad passing of Doug Pitman

It is with deep sadness that we share the news of the passing of Doug Pitman our dear colleague and friend who passed away on Saturday 6 September 2025

Doug will be remembered by many of us as one of the first distributors of the operating microscope in the UK championing its use since the early 1990s. He was very well known in endodontic circles and an enormously enthusiastic, kind and warm person that was part of our endodontic meetings in the UK and Europe for decades.

Chris Emery, a good friend of Doug's, has kindly written an obituary for Doug below. Our thoughts are with his family, friends, and all who knew him during this difficult time. We will share details regarding any memorial services or opportunities to pay tribute as we receive them.

Phil Tomson, BES President.

For those of us who trained and practised before microscopes were part of everyday endodontics, the change they brought was profound. It is hard to convey to colleagues who have never worked without one just how great the contrast was—like stepping from black and white into colour. The arrival of the operating microscope quite literally opened our eyes to what was possible.

Doug Pitman understood that potential from the outset. Having founded DP Medical in 1987 to supply optical and imaging systems for surgery, by the early 1990s he saw how the microscope could transform endodontics in the UK. Through DP Medical he became the first UK distributor of Global Surgical operating microscopes, and for many of us our very first instrument—and with it, a giant step forward in practice—came from Doug.

That pioneering role made him an honorary endodontist. His DP Medical trade-stand was a fixture at BES and other meetings, where his warmth and generosity made him as much a part of the community as any clinician. He fostered friendships, encouraged innovation, and supported the specialty's growth in countless ways.

His Company grew steadily, expanding across medical fields and into theatre and imaging at scale. Even after stepping back from day-to-day leadership, Doug remained central to the company's ethos and deeply proud of the values-driven team he had built.

Away from work, Doug's passion for craftsmanship and the sea found perfect expression in Rogue, his lovingly restored 1934 P. C. Crossley-designed Bermudan sloop. In later years, even as his health declined, he continued to sail with friends—ale in hand, conversation flowing, the sea as companion. Indeed, he was out on the water the very day before he passed away.

Doug's legacy lies in more than microscopes. He changed the way many of us practise, he built a company people were proud to belong to, and he made every gathering warmer by his presence. He will be remembered with great affection and respect by colleagues and friends alike, and he will be missed at our meetings, on the water, and in our lives.
